The older teens could also participate in a workshop of modern dance by Ramses Papa. Lots of floorwork, beautiful music and new material made for an interesting hour and a half.



Every two years we make a study trip abroad with our Company students. In March we took 15 girls to New York. The trip included workshops of all sorts, masterclasses, three shows on- and off-Broadway, sightseeing, and of course, LOTS and LOTS of dance classes!

The musical was very funny and truly spectacular. (about Aladdin the Broadway Musical)




I really enjoyed these jazz classes and I feel that this experience really helped me grow as a dancer!




And just like we are used to, every other year we have a choreography competition!
